





A Cornucopia of Blessings: TRCollections pre-Thanksgiving pop-up shop

The only thing better than getting a good deal on gifts for the holiday season is when you can avoid the freezing temperatures, crazy traffic, searching for a parking spot, and crowds of people. If you're thinking going to etsy.com/shop/trcollections is the way to go you would be half right. On Wednesday November 20, 2019 TRCollections hosted it's third pop-up shop since transitioning to E-Commerce. The intent, according to the TRCollections team, was to allow our customers who enjoyed shopping in person when we were Gallery U that same opportunity. There was human interaction, refreshments available, for every purchase customers were entered into a drawing for a chance to win a prize, and 30% off to the public was a nice incentive. For the loyal customers getting to peruse the merchandise and buy in person, the discount was icing on the cake. One such customer expressed exasperation that there was no longer a brick and mortar shop, noting that it was a unique store. The unique she is referring to is best summarized by a client from the Troy clinic who has noticed she is less nervous, able to concentrate better,











and not think about her accident. Sheila feels that the training she is receiving will help her to one day be gainfully employed. For Sheila seeing her pieces being sold is an amazing feeling. Creating a shop on Etsy not only allows consumers all over the world to purchase pieces, clients get verifiable proof that despite their disability they can thrive. In addition to the discount to the public, employees were able to combine their 30% discount. Suffice to say a lot of presents were purchased that day. The sun was shining and the temperatures were very pleasant for this time of year in Michigan. Native Michiganders or anyone who has resided in the state for even 180 consecutive days know nice weather is gift in and of itself. The biggest gift is intangible. After Gallery U transitioned to Etsy, customers noticed the absence of the brick and mortar shop and requested to shop in person. In doing so the community helped to destigmatize TBI, gifting the clients confidence and motivation. Although it cannot be seen or touched, it is felt. JT's Shake Shack Review



I ventured out today with staff member Emily to check out one of the local Shake Shack locations. I'll start out by saying that everything is ala carte ordering. I'm going to review the CHICKEN SHACK sandwich, the crinkle cut fries and the peach cobbler shake.



Let's start with the CHICKEN SHACK; the \$6.69 sandwich had a nice crunchy batter with a slight seasoning to it. The batter had just the right amount batter, not too heavy but enough to make you feel satisfied that you ate a sandwich. It comes with lettuce, pickles and mayo.

To accompany my chicken sandwich, I had an order of the crinkle cut fries, which at \$2.99 might seem a little pricey but you can't go wrong with crinkle cut fries, I highly encourage you splurge and add the fries.



I finished my meal with a \$5.29 piece of heaven. The Oh My Pie shake was made with vanilla custard and Black Bird bakery peach pie. They mix the pieces of the pie with fantastic vanilla custard. It is a taste so good it will make you want to scream hallelujah!

What is your job title?


I am the front desk assistant at the Human Resources Department.
